TH - This means top hand, which is the hand you write with and *upper register* on your harp.

BH - This means the bottom hand, which is the hand you don't write with and the *lower register* on your harp.

Middle C - Middle C is the RED string that is closest to being in the middle of your harp. The middle C string helps to divide your harp in that strings above middle C are played with the top hand, strings lower than middle C are played with the bottom hand.

Chords - Chords are more than two strings played, generally 3 or 4 strings, played simultaneously or consecutively. They will be written in two different ways: Examples:

Play the bass strings individually. In this example, you will play a G string with your \mathbf{TH} , the same time you play the \mathbf{C} & D with the \mathbf{BH} .

You will play all four strings simultaneously. Pluck the G string with the TH, and at the same time, pluck the C, E, and G with the BH. In this pattern, finger numbers are not written. They will always be played with the 3rd, 2nd and 1st fingers

All RED strings are C. All BLUE strings are F
